1. I have been working with Michael K. regarding the Clarity Statement. Michael has conversed with the World Board and we will most likely amend the current motion to include the paragraph taken directly from the introduction of the basic text. This will increase the likelihood of the motion being passed at the World level.
2. I received a request from an Area Activities Chair for copy of our insurance policy.
3. I consulted with Al S. regarding the completion of the OCNA & ORSCNA incorporation. Hopefully, Al will report that this item has been resolved. It appears we need to update policy to insure names in the documents are updated each July. See page 16 of our meeting minutes.
4. We would like to limit the majority of the discussion regarding the theft of NA funds to the RCM meeting. We will ask the Treasurer to give some basic balance information on this matter in her report.

Regional Delegate

I have been in communication with the WSO and the World Board regarding the Ohio Region's proposed motion for the 2006 Conference Agenda Report. According to Becky Meyer from the WSO, all correspondence needs to be with the regional delegate. Additionally, there is a specific system for proposed items to be considered by the World Board. An excerpt of her email states:

"The system was created with long term planning in mind. This means that the ideas that we discussed at WSC 2004 will be seen in project plans at WSC 2006. Conference policy actually prevents prioritizing and adopting a project during the same WSC that it is proposed. This is to allow for planning and to minimize reactions on the floor of the conference. In order for this to work effectively, there needs to be a dialogue between the regions and the World Board. A motion in the CAR should be the last option and used only when the region and the World Board cannot come to an agreement. A regional motion forces a two-year delay in the consideration of a project plan for the idea it contains."

I later spoke with Craig Robertson, Vice-Chair of the World Board, who concurred with Becky's citation of the policy. The main point that they made was that our motion includes language that has not been approved by the Literature Review process. After relaying this information to Steve H., the maker of the motion, he agreed to delete the second paragraph and only submit the first paragraph, which is already fellowship-approved language.

Craig was then advised of the change, and I objected to the amended language being classified as a "project" as defined by the above – referenced project approval system. The basis of the objection was due to the fact that the first paragraph of the motion is an excerpt of our existing recovery literature, and therefore it should need no further literature review. I also challenged the two-year period for having it implemented if in fact it were approved by the conference participants, citing the We Do Recover reading becoming available for sale within a few months of its approval at the WSC 2004. Craig and I are scheduled to talk again tomorrow night prior to the July 15 meeting of the World Board.

Basic Text Project

Due to the WSO being short staffed, there have been no NAWS News publications since the December 2004 edition. As a result, I contacted Anthony Edmondson, WSO manager, about progress on the Basic Text project. He advised me that stories were still being solicited until December 2005. He also stated that the workgroup responsible for this project had begun contacting the authors of the Basic Text's current stories to see if they wanted to update them. The workgroup is also exploring some nontraditional methods of soliciting such as conducting interviews for addicts who face challenges in writing. There is also a suggested format for groups, ASC's, and RSC's who wish to conduct writing workshops.

Public Relations Handbook

The workgroup for the Public Relations Handbook has release the first chapters for fellowship review. Anyone is allowed to participate in the process by going online to <http://portaltools.na.org/PortalTools/subscriptions/Login.cfm>. The review process ends August 1, 2005 for these chapters, and chapters 5-8 will become available September 1, 2005.

Issue Discussion Topics

The response to the issue discussion topics has been well received; the ACS and RSC who have done workshops have reported exceptional feedback. Addict may also participate in online issue discussion boards by going to <http://www.wsoinc.org/cgi-bin/topics/ikonboard.cgi>.

In the future, we plan to fine-tune the projects we have started and add new ideas and projects to our effort. We also intend to archive the information and send it to NA World Services so future H&I committees may be able to use it in their respective H&I communities.

If the motion passes today to have a Regional H&I Subcommittee, we plan to incorporate the position of H&I Coordinator within the subcommittee guidelines. The function of the position would be delegated to a subcommittee participant through an election or an appointment process that we will have to develop within the committee. More will be revealed.

Something else we have discussed is having a place on the Ohio web site just for Regional H&I. This would enable us to present information to our Regions and Areas and not just rely on a transfer of info through word of mouth or reports that sometimes don't make it to the people it concerns. We feel our efforts could be increased if vital information were more accessible. The web site could give us that edge.

At this time, we have a good relationship with Recovery Services for Institutions in Ohio and we hope only to improve that relationship in the future through more direct communication and through offering more services that will help in the effort of reaching more addicts seeking recovery behind the walls.

In the past, our efforts with institutions were vast and intense throughout the state of Ohio. Over the past several years, our efforts have leveled off and even decreased as a result of a lack of participation in H&I. Those of us still around from the days when H&I and PI were the most effective way of getting the word out about NA long to see the resurrection of these efforts the way they were when recovery was in its infancy in Ohio so many years ago! We are here because of meetings which increased in number as a direct result of our H&I and PI efforts and not as a direct result of conventions and functions which have tapped our human resources and defocused us from our 12th Step principle of carrying the message to the addict who still suffers. This is not to say that conventions and functions are not important, but it is time to take a step back and look at the balance. May we all look at what's going on and make a conscious effort to improve on our efforts to carry the message to the still suffering addict and may we pray that we find the means in which to do that. Let us spend out time, money, and energy in improving our efforts to carry this life saving message to those who so desperately need it!

Reports from Deliberations

Notes from RD/RCM Meeting on 07-09-05

NOTE FROM THE ORSCNA SECRETARY:

The RD did not submit a written report. I was only given the handwritten notes that someone took during the meeting. Since I was not at the meeting, the following is a summary of these notes as best as I could make them out.

1. There were some concerns discussed regarding the billboard posters. Was there favoritism in the placement of the billboards? Why should they only be put up to cover 14 counties in this one Area? Would like to see a motion for the Region to purchase posters and allow the Areas to be responsible for putting them up or maybe a committee to make the placement selections of future billboard posters.

See Motion 2005:38 in New Business. After some discussion, the maker of the motion withdrew the motion. The RCM's reached a consensus that they would consider the effectiveness of these 2 billboards at the next RSC and discuss this further in their Areas before pursuing the purchase of more billboard posters.

FYI FROM THE ORSCNA SECRETARY:

Please refer to Motion 2005:04, dated 1-09-05, where the RCM's directed Ozzie O. to look into the purchase of NA billboard posters. Also refer to Item #9 on page 17 of the April 2005 minutes which references Ozzie's report and poster designs. His report and poster designs were included in the "mailed" copies of the April minutes. Motion 2005:27, dated 4-10-05, went back to the Areas in April and was passed at the July 2005 RSC. The intent of the motion encourages other Areas to post these signs if the response in this one Area is a success.

2.
