Public Information

Hello to all Trusted Servants and members of Narcotics Anonymous in Ohio. First, let me give thanks for the opportunity to serve in this position. I consider this a privilege. I am pleased to inform you that usage of our website has increased from the previous years. The exact percentage is difficult to calculate, but I would estimate we have at least a 20% increase over 1999. A large percentage of people arriving on our page come from links on the NA world site with a relatively equal amount of visitors arriving through various search engines. My interpretation of these statistics is that visitors to Ohio are seeking meeting information prior to their arrival, which leads me to our next topic.

40% to 50% of requests on our site are for schedule information. I've been working diligently to keep our schedules and events pages current. I have had much success with updating a large portion of the schedules, but this is not without its problems.

1. Most of the updates are within the Ohio Region. I believe all ORSCNA Area pages have been updated within the past 3 months. I have only had 2 Areas in the Buckeye Region contact me regarding schedules. I might also add that I am severely deficient in contact information for that Region. I am also at a dilemma in regards to BRSCNA functions. There have been a few contacts, for which I am grateful, but I feel that a large portion of the Buckeye Region is not been served.
2. The next issue is related to the credibility of information I receive. I sometimes get an email from someone I do not know and cannot verify the information given. There have also been conflicts of information received. I urge all areas to appoint 1 person with an email address that I can communicate with. Referring back to the number of people requesting schedule information, I deem this to be one of the most important functions of the website – to provide current and accurate information about schedules and functions.

I have only had one request for an information packet from an interested professional. I was completely surprised to find that our page "Information for Professionals" contained: *"Or you can send email to info@naohio.org. We would like to send you an information packet containing materials that explain the NA program, along with the current state meeting schedule."* Thanks to the ORSCNA Secretary for handling this issue. If we can decide what the information packet is, I will promptly replied to these requests in the future. I am also happy to inform you that the secure section of the website, mentioned in our policy, has been created. The ORSCNA minutes and motions are posted there. This area requires a password, which can be obtained from me.

Lastly, I would like to announce that we are now posting flyers to functions for download in .pdf format. This is on a trial basis, but I have seen as much as 25% of the traffic on our site requesting these files. I will continue to monitor their popularity. Directions to events are also being included on many events. I'm sorry to say I have not found an efficient method for attaching maps at this time.

In conclusion, I would like to say that the overall status of our website is well and productive with some concerns. I will address the issues of ownership, contact information, and hosting at the meeting.

Shared Services Ad-hoc

This memorandum is to give the history of our meeting, rather than minutes of motions and votes counted. We are operating towards a consensus based decision making model.

Al S. opened the meeting at noon. Our first agenda item was a status review. Most of Shared Services is up to speed except the Convention. There was a question about the phoneline getting together. We shared information about phoneline expenses and the Buckeye Region's carrier bills. We have separate lines and the service sends out schedules on our behalf. There was a suggestion to provide State Schedules to TownHall II instead of the confusion of different schedules going different places. We reviewed the proposal sent back to the regions regarding the incorporation of OCNA. OCNA's 8, 9, and 10 were incorporated, the benefit was monetary protection, as the Convention Committee becomes the liable parties. OCNA 11 did not renew their status with the state, but OCNA is still on record as inactive.

We agree to assess the current status of OCNA corporation. The lawyer requires officer's names and \$75.00 to reinstate. We discussed resurrecting the Corporation with the current OCNA Committee for their protection and place a Board as part of the service structure in the future. The Board members should hold positions of "Advisors" especially in the area of finance, because the "Treasurer" would be on the Convention Committee. One member should serve as "Chairperson". We are including a Secretary and Vice-Chairperson. The discussion of qualifications to hold these positions was tabled until we begin discussion of election procedures.

We agree the board will consist of at least two members residing in each Region. The Board will meet twice a year to attend to the corporation business. Board members will meet with, and be available to, their respective Committee Chairpersons, especially in the area of hotel negotiations. In addition, the Board will meet quarterly with the Convention Committee. We began discussions concerning financing the Convention, with consideration of what we already have in place. We could provide the same amount of start-up money at the end of every Convention. After much discussion we find that we need to make a decision of either a flat amount or a percentage. We feel safer with a percentage, but want to put a cap on how much is turned over. We suggest 20% not to exceed \$2,000.00. Administration expenses will need to be put in a budget to be pre-approved by both Regions and held in petty cash. This budget would come from the Convention, be subject to review, and be minus any roll-over amount. We're working towards a formal proposal with all the specifics identified.

The Board will serve as keeper of the archives, all reports, minutes, and intangible properties will be kept in the central location, such as a self store unit or an NA office, with keys in both Regions.

We came back to discuss the Board's and Convention Committee's responsibilities and how the Board would interact with the Committee. We are concerned about the usage of the term power. Convention Guidelines should be provided and administration falls on the Board. The Convention Chairperson can table anything and bring it to the Board for interpretation, who acts as a subcommittee to the Regions. Anything that requires further resolve will go through both Regions. This does not imply veto power or authority over the Convention Committee, but when the Convention Committee's decisions affect more than their own operations, the Board may turn it over to the host Region. Any member may approach for redress and the Board may bring it to the Regions.

We want to approve produce a proposal which covers: Elections, Terms (staggered and alternates), Archives, Bylaws, and Convention Guidelines. We briefly discussed a member proposing to serve as a statewide liaison to the correctional facilities. We recognize that the service structure calls for groups to create these positions and hold elections as the need arises. We adjourned at 2:45PM. Our next meeting will be January 27th, 2001 at 11AM in the Richland Hospital in Mansfield, Ohio.
