Hi Family,

Good to be here. I apologize in advance for having to leave today by 5 p.m. In addition, I will not be present on Sunday. My daughter is performing in her high school play Saturday night & Sunday afternoon, it is important for me to be there. I need to ask the Region to allow a new business motion today so that I can have the funds to attend WSC when I leave here. I was able to arrange a flight to the WSC for 273.50. At the last Regional meeting, I received a check for 300.00. I am returning the balance from the airline ticket (26.50) and leftover travel funds (15.00) from the Chicago trip.

I attended the Worldwide Workshop in Chicago the first weekend of February. There were not as many in attendance as we had hoped. One of the purposes of the weekend was to allow people who are not usually in contact with World Services to have that opportunity and to allow World Services to have interaction with more members of the fellowship. World wanted to communicate with members other than just the RDs and RDAs. That purpose was not met, as I sat in group sessions I realized that most of the addicts that were there were involved or had been involved in World Services on some level. There were many RDs and RDAs in attendance. Perhaps we will address this issue at the conference.

Robin, Michael and I attended different workshops so that we could gather more variety of information to bring back to the Region. Some of the topics and discussions were very similar or the same as those discussions held in September at the World Services Meeting. Sponsorship was discussed again as well as the NA History slide show. I attended the grassroots workshop; Getting Members Involved in Service, and the workshops on Cultural Diversity, History of NA, and Medication in Recovery. I have brought some of the NA History material today. I will not include all discussion from the workshops in this report at this time. We should discuss some of the topics from the WW at some point but we probably do not have the time this weekend to devote to these discussions. We are concerned with gathering the conscience of the Region today, but I would suggest that we return to this at some point when we have the time to actually go further in depth. These topics have continually surfaced at our Region and are worth pursuing. We will have the discussion from the workshops, in writing, available for the minutes.

I attended the CAR workshop for BLASCNA and NWOASCNA in Findlay. Approximately 20 addicts were in attendance. All of the CAR motions were discussed in length as well as some of the Conference approval track motions.

Public Information

Hello Family,

Once again let me take this opportunity to express my gratitude for allowing me to serve in this position, I consider it an honor.

Website statistics have not changed much in recent months. We are averaging about 110 visitors to our site each day (up from 51 in the first quarter one year ago). Our total file size usage has increased dramatically. This comes mostly from the larger files we have available such as flyers and the State Schedule. As far as I can tell we have not crossed the 1/3-gigabyte/month mark and we are allowed 3 gigabytes/month on our present plan.

I am happy to say we have delivered 610 copies of the Ohio State Meeting Schedule from our website since implementing a test in January. This method has saved the Region at least \$200 in printing cost and has not seemed to be a usage problem as I feared since we have been able to compact it's size to 233 KB.

We were offline for ½ day last month due to a mix up in billing. It seems that the bill was not paid for several months (so they tell me). I called for some technical assistance and the technician noticed this and disconnected our service. At this particular time the bill had actually been paid, but it took several hours to get back online.

The aforementioned technical assistance was an exciting technology we now have available on our site. PHP (Hypertext Preprocessor) scripting language and my SQL database are now implemented and working on our website. The combination of these two technologies provides a simple and efficient way to provide services we discussed almost 9 months ago. I am still behind the learning curve of these languages, but we will soon have the ability to display any information in any way we wish.

A user will be able to find a meeting by Region, Area, Day, Time, County, format or, our most popular request, City. (Or any way we choose). Additionally the information can be updated or modified by any number of people by use of the database security system, which is quite impressive. What this means is an area can assign a person to keep their area schedules up to date. That person will be able to add, delete or modify that areas meeting information, but nothing else. Another person can update that Areas Events, but nothing else. The results will be instantaneous to the viewer looking for meetings or events. The possibilities are as vast as our imagination.

Another benefit to these languages is the output format. I am sure some of you have noticed meeting information that looks sloppy or doesn't line up right. The new system will cure this. Here are a couple of examples:

I would like input from members and users as to how we should use these new tools. We could also use a few "Testers" with various types of configurations, i.e. Cable, DSL, Modem, IE, Netscape, AOL, to access this info and report back on speed and "viewability".

Last I would like to address the lack of information concerning OCNA. Many requests have come in regarding OCNA. I simply have no information to supply. I have emailed and called all the addresses and numbers I could find and have had no response. There is only a listing in the BRSCNA Activities Page, but they have requested more info from NA Ohio. There is no flyer either. If anyone has information, flyers, or contact numbers/addresses, Please send them to us so we can fulfill these requests.
